Wisden poll results of India's greatest test batsman: Wisden conducted the poll on its official facebook account to choose the among 16 Indian Batsmen. The list was later slashed to four finalists with Dravid against Sunil Gavaskar and Tendulkar and Virat Kohli. Around 11400 fans took part in the poll.[4] tops the list with around 52% of the total votes and became India's greatest test batsman. Much like [4] batted during his playing career, he dug in and fought back in the poll, eventually crossing the line with a decent lead at the very end.

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.....[1] stepped down as International Cricket Council(ICC) chairman after his two 2 year tenure(4 years). He is the first independent chairman. His tenure ended on July 1, 2020. Deputy Chairman[2] will take charge as interim chairman until the next chairman is elected.[1] was elected as ICC's first independent Chairman in May 2016. He was also elected to the Board of Control for Cricket in India (BCCI) vice- president in 2005 and elevated as President in 2008. He held the post as president from 2008 to 2011 from October, 2015 to May, 2016. He resigned the post and took over as chairman of the ICC. He first joined Vidarbha Cricket Association (VCA) as an Executive Member in 1983 and twice held the position of President from 1997-1999 and then 2001-2009.[2] is the former president of the Singapore Cricket Association. He was elected as ICC's deputy chairman in 2017. Currently he is a part of many committees, including the Finance & Commercial Affairs, Nominations, Development (chair) and Membership. According to the ICC rules,[1] can stay for another two-year term as a maximum of three terms are allowed. The election process of selecting the next chairman is likely to be approved by the ICC board soon. Confirming[1] departure and[2] elevation, the ICC said in a statement that the Board is expected to approve the election procedure for the successor. The [1] Institute of Space Physics(IRF) will explore Venus for the second time through the India's 1st Venus Mission Shukrayaan-1. The Shukrayaan-1 is scheduled for launch at the end of... from Sriharikota, Andhra Pradesh. Key Points:-

- Venusian Neutrals Analyzer (VNA), the satellite instrument of IRF will study the interaction between

the charged particles of the sun and the atmosphere and exosphere of the planet. It takes six months for the spacecraft to fly to Venus and it will spend a year in orbit around Venus to explore the planet. ASPERA-4 (Analyzes of Space Plasma and Energetic Atoms), IRF's instrument studied Venus on European spacecraft Venus Express between 2006-2014. Plasma properties around Venus are measured intimately through the satellite tv for pc instruments. ASPERA-Four consists of 4 different sensors to investigate energetic impartial atoms and plasma particles. ASPERA-Four proved that water on Venus is escaping to an area with vitality obtained from the photovoltaic wind. IRF's satellite tv for pc instrument on Shukrayaan-1 can be half of a bigger Indian instrument package deal and be the ninth technology of IRF's collection of miniaturized ion and ENA devices.

- The primary technology SARA (Sub-keV Atom Reflecting Analyzer) was launched on Indian spacecraft Chandrayaan-1 that explored the Moon in [3] SARA consisted of two sensors:
 - i) A detector for energetic impartial atoms

The first standoff began as a clash between Indian and Chinese soldiers at a beach of..... [1], a lake shared between India and Tibet, China, with the Line of Actual Control (LAC) passing through it. A video showed soldiers from both nations engaging in fisnights and stone-pelting along the LAC. On 10/11 May 2020, another clash took place. A number of soldiers on both sides had sustained injuries. Indian media reported that around 72 Indian soldiers were injured in the confrontation at [1], and some had to be flown to hospitals in Leh, Chandi Mandir and Delhi. According to Indian media reports, on 10 May 2020, a spat began when the Chinese intruded into the Muguthang Valley and shouted at the Indian troops: "this is not your land. This is

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not Indian Territory ... so, just go back." An Indian lieutenant responded by punching a Chinese major's nose. On 21 May 2020, Chinese troops had entered the Indian Territory in the..... [2] valley and objected to the road construction by India within the (undisputed) Indian Territory. The road under construction is a branch of the Darbuk–Shyok–DBO Road which leads into the [2] valley. On 24 May, another report said that the Chinese soldiers invaded India at three different places: Hot Springs, Patrol Point 14, and Patrol Point 15. At each of these places, around 800–1,000 Chinese soldiers reportedly crossed the border and settled at a place about 2–3 km (1–2 mi) from the border. On 15 June 2020, Indian and Chinese troops clashed for six hours in a steep section of a mountainous region in the [2] Valley. The fighting resulted in the deaths of 20 Indian soldiers of 16th Bihar Regiment including its commanding officer, Colonel Santosh Babu. While three Indian soldiers died on the spot, others died later due to injuries and hypothermia. Most of the soldiers who were killed fell to their deaths after losing their footing or being pushed off the ridge. The clash took place near the fast-flowing [2] River, and some soldiers from both sides fell into a rivulet and were killed or injured. Bodies were later recovered from the Shyok River.

The US administration said that it was extending the 60-day ban on immigration and non-immigrant worker visas till the end of 2020. Popular work visas including the much-coveted [1] and [2] and certain categories of H-4, J, and L visas shall also remain suspended until December 31, the White House said in a press note. The move, US President Donald Trump said, was to protect domestic workers who had been impacted due to a contraction in the economy in the wake of the Covid-19 pandemic. In order to fill a vacuum of highly-skilled low-cost employees in IT and other related domains, the US administration issues a certain number of visas each year which allows companies from outside the US to send employees to work on client sites. Of these work visas, the [1] remains the most popular among Indian IT companies. The US government has a cap of 85,000 total [1] visas for each year. Of this, 65,000[1] visas are issued to highly skilled foreign workers, while the rest 20,000 can be additionally allotted to highly skilled foreign workers who have a higher education or masters degree from an American university.
