He ranked 66 with Forbes Magazine estimated earning of around 26 million USD (24 million from endorsements and 2 million from salary/winnings). Tennis player [2] tops the list for the first time with estimated earnings 106.3 million USD. He placed 5th in the 2019 list with the estimated earnings of 95 million USD [3] who topped the 2019 list with the estimated earnings of 109 million USD dropped to 3rd rank in 2020 list with 104 million USD. World Food Prize is also referred as 'Nobel Prize in the field of agriculture' or "Nobel Prize for Food and Agriculture." World Food Prize: This award was issued from the World Food Prize Foundation in the Digital Dialogue with Gebisa Ejeta, chair of World Food Prize Laureate Selection Committee. It is awarded for specific, significant achievement of an individual that advances human development with an increased quality, quantity, availability or access to food through innovative interventions within the scope of the food system.[2] Indian Agricultural scientist received the first World Food Prize in 1987.[1] is an alumnus of Ohio State University(OSU) and he began his research career at the International Institute of Tropical Agriculture (IITA) in Nigeria. He is a professor in the College of Food, Agriculture and Environment Sciences(CFAES) at OSU and founding Director of the Carbon Management and Sequestration Centre established in 2000 at CFAES, Ohio. Three separate Climate Change conferences of the United Nations adopted his strategy of restoring soil health to sequestering carbon

In 2007 IPCC was named co-recipient of Nobel Prize and He was recognised with the Nobel Peace Prize certificate for his contribution to the Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change(IPCC) reports. He received the Swaminathan Award in 2009 and the Glinka World Soil Prize and the GCHERA World Agriculture Prize in 2018.

Falcon9 Rocket:

Falcon9 is the world's first orbital class, two stage reusable rocket designed and manufactured by SpaceX for the transportation of humans and payloads into Earth orbit. Crew [1] Spacecraft: The only spacecraft capable of carrying upto 7 passengers to and from earth orbit and the first spacecraft to take humans to space stations. Equipped with 16 Draco thrusters used to orient the spacecraft each capable of generating 90 pounds of force in vacuum space. The mission was initially scheduled to launch on May 27 delayed at the last minute due to weather conditions. The astronauts named the SpaceX Crew [1] Capsule, "Endeavour" after the retired winged orbiters, stating that they both had their first flight on the shuttle Endeavour. This is the first mission NASA astronauts launched in the United States since the retirement of the Space Shuttle in 2011. Uttarakhand Governor Baby Rani Maurya approved the declaration of [1] in Chamoli district as the state’s summer capital in compliance with the provisions of clause (3) of[2] of the Constitution of India.
