- .....[1] said Friday he is resigning as head of Cuba's Communist Party, ending an era of formal leadership by himself and his brother that began with the 1959 revolution. The 89-year-old Mr Castro made the announcement Friday in a speech at the opening of the Eighth congress of the ruling party, the only one allowed on the island. The Communist Party of Cuba is the ruling political party in the Republic of Cuba. The Cuban constitution ascribes the role of the party to be the "leading force of society and of the state". It was founded on 3 October 1965 as a successor of the United Party of the Cuban Socialist Revolution, which was in turn made up of the 26th of July Movement and Popular Socialist Party that seized power in Cuba after the 1959 Cuban Revolution. He said he was retiring with the sense of having "fulfilled his mission and confident in the future of the fatherland." He didn't say who he would endorse as his successor as first secretary of the Communist Party. But he previously indicated that he favors yielding control to 60-year-old B , who succeeded him as president in 2018 and is the standard bearer of a younger generation of loyalists who have been pushing an economic opening without touching Cuba's one-party system.

Second, the impact of this legislation on the health workforce and healthcare denotes a paradigm shift. Initial efforts at regulating allied health professions were participatory, beginning in the early 1990s. After numerous consultations with key stakeholders, the first draft Bill was uploaded on the health ministry's website in 2015, inviting public comments. The overwhelming number of responses triggered another, more intensive process of public consultations, expert meetings, reviews, and discussions with stakeholders, including states. The health department-related parliamentary standing committee made 110 recommendations. The UCC calls for the formulation of one law for India, which would be applicable to all religious communities in matters such as marriage, divorce, inheritance, adoption. ....[2] Civil Code (also known as .....[2] Family Law) is based on the Portuguese Civil Code which was introduced in 1870. In Indian Constitution, UCC is placed among the non-justiciable Directive Principles of State Policy under article .....[3]. UCC emerged as a crucial topic of interest in Indian politics following the Shah Bano case in 1985. The debate arose when the question of making certain laws applicable to all citizens without abridging the fundamental right of right to practice religious functions. The debate then focused on the Muslim Personal Law, which is partially based on the Sharia law, permitting unilateral divorce, polygamy and putting it among the legally applying the Sharia law. UCC was proposed twice, in November 2019 and March 2020 but was withdrawn soon both of the times without introduction in parliament.

In addition to its annual awards ceremonies, BAFTA has an international programme of learning events and initiatives offering access to talent through workshops, masterclasses, scholarships, lectures, and mentoring schemes in the United Kingdom and the United States. BAFTA started out as the British Film Academy, founded in 1947 by a group of directors: David Lean, Alexander Korda, Roger Manvell, Laurence Olivier, Emeric Pressburger, Michael Powell, Michael Balcon, Carol Reed, and other major figures of the British film industry. David Lean was the founding chairman of the academy. The first Film Awards ceremony took place in May 1949, honouring the films The Best Years of Our Lives, Odd Man Out and The World Is Rich.

Britain’s Prince.....[1], the Duke of Edinburgh, husband of Queen Elizabeth II, the longest-serving royal consort in the history of British passed away at the age of 99 in Windsor Castle, London, United Kingdom. He was born as the Prince of Greece and Denmark on 10th June 1921 in Greece. Prince.....[1] joined the British Royal Navy in 1939 and served in the Mediterranean and Pacific during World War 2. He renounced his Greek title and became a British citizen and took his mother’s anglicised name, Mountbatten. King George VI bestowed the title of His Royal Highness on Philip and he was created Duke of Edinburgh, Earl of Merioneth and Baron Greenwich. He married Queen Elizabeth II on 20th November 1947 in Westminster Abbey. He retired from Public life in August 2017. ....[2], India’s first Union Minister of Environment and Member of the Legislative Assembly(MLA) from Wankaner, Gujarat passed away at the age of 88 in Morbi, Gujarat. He was born on 20th August 1932 in Wankaner, Gujarat. ....[2] was the head of the erstwhile princely state of Wankaner, Gujarat. He was elected as a member of the Gujarat legislative assembly in 1962 as an independent and later elected as a member of the Swatantra Party in 1967. As a member of Congress, He became the Member of Parliament from the Surendranagar constituency for two terms from 1979 to 1989. He served as the first Environment Minister of India from 1982 to 1984 after the Ministry was established under Prime minister Indira Gandhi in November 1980. He has authored the book titled “The Eco-vote: Peoples’ Representatives and Global Environment” (1985).

Russian President .....[1] has signed a legislation which will enable him to run for two or more consecutive six-year terms, effectively permitting him to remain in office till 2036. The legislation formalizes changes to the Russian Constitution which were endorsed by people through a referendum held in 2020. Before the signing of the new legislation, a President could serve only a maximum of two consecutive six-year terms. ....[1] completes his ongoing Fourth Term as President of Russia in 2024. He has already governed Russia either as President or as Prime Minister for more than 20 years, making it the longest period a leader has been in power since .....[2]. He was first elected as Prime Minister of Russia in 1999 and as President in 2000. Russia’s Presidential Term was lengthened to 6 years (from 4 years) in 2008. In countries like US, France and others the President can serve only a maximum of two consecutive terms. The legislation .....[1] has now signed formalises changes to the Russian Constitution that were endorsed



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by the people through a referendum held last year. The changes he proposed were approved by over 78% of the vote. In January 2020, he called for changes to the Constitution, which included the removal of term limits. In a speech to the State Duma (Russia's Lower House of Parliament) in March 2020, He cited the example of US President .....[3], who served four terms — starting 1932, 1936, 1940 and 1944. ....[3] four-term presidency paved the way for the 22nd Amendment to the US Constitution, ratified in 1951, that limited the Presidential term to two four-year terms. ....[1], a former KGB officer who is now 68, completes his ongoing six-year tenure — his fourth as President — in 2024. He has already run the country either as President or as Prime Minister for more than 20 years.
