- The book was published by **Penguin** Random House India and narrates about Dr Subbarao's career, which would help inspire young professionals to navigate their career paths.
- D Subbarao served as Governor of the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) for five years (2008-13).
- He also served as Secretary to the Prime Minister's Economic Advisory Council (2005-07).

Note: His previous book, "Who Moved My Interest Rate: Leading the Reserve Bank Through Five Turbulent Years," was published by Penguin Random House India in 2016.

MHA grants NoC to Rename 8 Railway Stations in UP

The Ministry of Home Affairs (MHA) has granted No Objection Certificate (NoC) to change the names of **eight railway stations** in Amethi, **Uttar Pradesh (UP)**. The renaming of railway stations were proposed by the government of UP.

i.The proposed name changes are as follows

- Fursatganj railway station to Tapeshwarnath Dham
- Kasimpur Halt to Jais City
- Jais to Guru Gorakhnath Dham
- Bani to Swami Paramhans
- Misrauli as Maa Kalikan Dham
- Nihalgarh to Maharaja Bijli Pasi
- Akbarganj to Maa Ahorwa Bhawani Dham
- Warisganj to Amar Shaheed Bhale Sultan

ii.The renamed railway stations will soon be updated by the Railway CRIS (Centre for Railway Information Systems).

Google Launched Google Wallet for Android Users in India

Google has launched **Google Wallet**, a secure and private digital wallet for all Android users in **India** to store cards, passes, tickets, keys, or IDs.

- It offers users a single, organised location for quick and easier access to digital documents integrated with QR codes.
- Google Wallet in India will not support payment-related features. **Google Pay**, Google's mobile payment app, will continue to serve the payment needs of users in India.



Google Wallet:

- The Google Wallet application was first launched in 2011. In 2015, it was succeeded by Android Pay as a replacement for Google Wallet.
- In 2018, Google announced a merger between Google Wallet and Android Pay application creating Google Pay.
- Google Wallet app available on the Google Play Store.

Note: Google Tez, now known as Google Pay, was launched in India on 18th September 2017.

Utility of Google Wallet:

i. Currently, Google Wallet supports access to digital documents from 20 Indian brands including e-commerce platform Flipkart, Airline companies such as Air India and Indigo, cinema multiplex chains PVR and INOX, MakeMyTrip (MMT), and more.

Additional info:

- The app available in India is slightly different from its international counterparts.
- In India, Google Wallet operates exclusively on Android phones and is not compatible with smartwatches or wearables, unlike in other countries.

Inter-Services Organisations (Command, Control and Discipline) Act, 2023 Enforced

- The Inter-Services Organisations (Command, Control and Discipline) Act, 2023 enforced by the **Ministry of Defence** (MoD) from May 10, 2024, aligns with the Government's theaterisation plan, aiming to integrate the Indian Army (IA), Indian Air Force (IAF), and Indian Navy (IN) capabilities.
- This legislation grants disciplinary and administrative powers to the heads of Inter-Services Organisations (ISOs) to ensure efficient resource utilization during wars and operations.
- Passed during the Monsoon Session of **2023** and assented by the President on August 15, 2023, it empowers Commanders-in-Chief (CIC) and Officers-in-Command (OIC) of ISOs to exercise disciplinary and administrative control over service personnel.

China emerged as Largest Trading Partner of India in FY24 with USD 118.4 Billion: GTRI Report

As per the data published by think tank **Global Trade Research Initiative (GTRI)**, China emerged as the largest trading partner of India with **USD 118.4 billion** two way commerce in **FY24 (2023-24)**. While, The United States of America (U.S.A.) with **USD 118.3 billion** was the 2nd largest trading partner of India in 2023-24.

Key Points:

- For FY24, China replaced the U.S.A. to become India's largest trading partner after a gap of

2 years.

ii. India-U.S. bilateral trade stood at **USD 118.3 billion** in 2023-24. The U.S.A. was India's top trading partner during FY22 and FY23.

iii. The United Arab Emirates (U.A.E.) with **USD 83.6 billion**, was the **3rd largest** trading partner of India in FY24, then followed by Russia (USD 65.7 billion), Saudi Arabia (USD 43.4 billion), and Singapore (USD 35.6 billion).

IAF Conducts Maiden Airdrop Test of BHISHM, World's 1st Air-Lifted Portable Hospital in Agra

On 14th May 2024, The Indian Air Force (IAF) conducted maiden air drop test of **BHISHM** portable cubes, World's 1st air-lifted portable hospital in Agra, Uttar Pradesh.

Key Points:

i. BHISHM portable cubes are part of broader initiative named **"Project BHISHM- Bharat health initiative for Sahyog, Hita and Maitri"**.

ii. This initiative is specifically designed to treat up to 200 casualties, emphasizing rapid response and comprehensive care.

iii. Indian Army introduced its latest innovation named **"Hexacopter Drone"** mounted by Machine Gun. Sirin

Hexadrones were developed by Ikran Aerospace and Technologies Private Limited (**IAATPL**).

Bank of Maharashtra tops among PSU banks in Business Growth in FY24; SBI FY24 net profit rises 21.59%

i. Bank of Maharashtra (**BoM**) emerged as the top performer among Public Sector Banks (PSBs) in terms of business growth during the Fiscal Year 2023-24 (FY24), according to published financial numbers of the public sector banks (PSBs). BoM recorded a remarkable **15.94%** rise in total business (domestic) in FY24.

ii. State Bank of India (**SBI**) followed closely with a growth rate of **13.12%**.

iii. SBI's total business (deposit and advances) stood significantly higher at **Rs 79,52,784 crore** (about 16.7 times) compared to BoM's **Rs 4,74,411 crore**.

iv. State Bank of India (SBI), the largest state-owned lender in India, announced its Q4FY24 results, showcasing robust performance with a net profit of **Rs 20,698.35 crore**, up 24% from Q4FY23.

ISRO's Mangalyaan-2 Mission to Include Helicopter, Sky Crane, Rover for Navigation on Mars

The Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO) has unveiled comprehensive strategy for its next Mars mission “**Mangalyaan-2**”. It was unveiled during special presentation held at the Space Application Centre (SAC) on the eve of National Technology Day (May 11th , 2024).

- With the successful launch of Mangalyaan-2 mission, India will become **4th** country in the world after United States of America (U.S.A.), Russia and China to successfully land a spacecraft on Mars.

Key Features:

i.ISRO plans to use a **Rover** and **helicopter** for Mars exploration which is similar to the National Aeronautics and Space Administration's (NASA) Perseverance Rover.

ii.At present, ISRO is working on a **supersonic Parachute** and **Sky-Crane system**, draws inspiration from deployment techniques of NASA.

- This deployment technique will ensure safe and accurate landing of Indian rover on Mars surface.

iii.The Mangalyaan-2 mission will be launched aboard the Geosynchronous Satellite Launch Vehicle Mk III (**LVM3**) .

iv.ISRO will develop technology customized specially to meet the unique requirements of Indian rover which includes: To refine the sky-crane system and other critical components of mission in order to withstand harsh conditions of Mars.

About Mangalyaan-1:

i.The mission was named Mars Orbiter Mission(**MOM**), launched by ISRO on 5th November, 2013 from Satish Dhawan Space Centre, Sriharikota, Andhra Pradesh (A.P.).

ii.It was successfully placed in Mars orbit on 24th September, 2014. It observed the planet Mars from 2014 to 2022.

iii.Its core objective was to study Martian surface and its mineral composition.

Blue Origin's NS-25 mission Lifted off with 6 Crew Members Including One Indian

On 19th May 2024, **New Shepard** rocket system built by **Blue Origin**, the company owned by Jeff Bezos, Founder of Amazon, under the space tourism mission named **New Shepard-25 (NS-25)** lifted off with **6** crew members including one Indian from Launch site one in West Texas, United States of America (U.S.A).

About NS-25 Mission:

i.It is the **7th** human space flight for the New Shepard program.

- Till date, the program has flown **31** human above the **Karman line**.

ii.The space flight travelled in the space at more than **3 times** the speed of sound and passed the Karman line.

iii.After spending time in zero gravity, the crew returns under parachutes.

Note: Karman line is internationally recognised boundary line of space i.e. 62 miles or 100 kms above the Earth.

Gopi Thotakura, the 1st Indian Space Tourist:

i. Among the 6 crew members, **Gopi Thotakura**, commercial jet pilot and entrepreneur from Andhra Pradesh (India), is the only Indian on this human space flight.

ii. He is the **1st** Indian space tourist and the **2nd** Indian to venture into space after Wing Commander Rakesh Sharma of Indian Army (**1984**).

iii. He is the co-founder of Preserve Life Corp, a global center for holistic wellness and applied health located near Hartsfield-Jackson Atlanta International Airport, U.S.A.

Other Crew Members:

i. Captain Ed Dwight is the **1st Black astronaut** on the space flight. He was selected by former President of United States of America (U.S.A.), John F Kennedy in 1961.

- Dwight became the oldest person to fly in space at the age of 90. He broke the record set by Canadian actor William Shatner who went to space on Blue Origin flight in 2021, as he is two months older than him.

ii. Names of other members are: Mason Angel (USA), Sylvain Chiron (France), Kenneth L. Hess (USA), Carol Schaller (USA).

MoRTH releases New Driving License Rules w.e.f. June 1, 2024; Makes Driving Tests at RTO Optional

i. The Ministry of Road Transport and Highways (**MoRTH**) announced new regulations aimed at simplifying the process of obtaining a driving license (DL) with effect from **1st June 2024**.

- Under the new regulations, applicants now have option to take their driving tests at privately operated driving training centres.
- This will reduce the congestion at **Regional Transport Offices** (RTOs).

ii. The new regulation has reduced the required documentation for new DL. The required documents will now be based on the type of vehicle, minimizing the need for physical reviews at RTOs.

iii. This also impose strict penalties for violations.

China Successfully Launches 'Chang'e-6,' World's 1st Mission to Bring Samples from Moon

China National Space Administration (CNSA) successfully launched an uncrewed lunar probe, namely "Chang'e-6," through **Long March- 5 Y8** carrier rocket from the Wenchang Space Launch Center in the southern province of Hainan, China.

Aim: It is the world's first mission to collect and bring back samples from the **far side** of the moon.

Note: The name of the mission 'Chang'e' is inspired from the name of Chinese Goddess moon.

About Chang'e-6 mission:

i. The spacecraft will land at Apollo Basin (an oldest known impact crater), located in South Pole – Aitken Basin on the far side of the moon.

ii. The entire duration of mission is expected to about **53 days**.

iii. The spacecraft has 4 main components which are: **an orbiter, a lander, a ascender and a returner**.

iv. It carries 4 payloads that were developed in cooperation with other countries, such as: Scientific instruments from France, Italy and European Space Agency (ESA) are aboard the Lander.

v. It also carries a miniature satellite named "**ICUBE-QAMAR cubesat**" from Pakistan.

Additional Information:

In November 2020, CNSA successfully launched the 8.2 tonne lunar probe namely "Chang'e-5" through Long March-5 rocket. It was the world's 1st near side moon-sample mission in 44 years.

Overview of World Press Freedom Index 2024: India ranks 159th, Norway Tops

i. According to the 22nd edition of the World Press Freedom Index (WPFI 2024) released by Reporters Without Borders (RSF – Reporters sans frontières in French), India is ranked 159th out of 180 countries with a score of 31.28.

- Norway tops the 2024 index for the 8th consecutive year followed by Denmark (2nd) and Sweden (3rd).
- The last 3 places are occupied by: Eritrea (180th); Syria (179th), and Afghanistan (178th).

ii. On the occasion of World Press Freedom Day 2024 (3rd May 2024), The United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization (UNESCO) released a report titled "Press and Planet in Danger: safety of environmental journalists; trends, challenges and recommendations".

The report highlighted that a total of 44 journalists reporting on environmental issues were killed in 15 different countries between 2009 and 2023,

Nepal government is set to introduced the new **Rs 100 currency note** featuring a map which includes the controversial border territories of Lipulekh, Limpiyadhura and Kalapani of Uttarakhand in its strategic northwest trijunction between India, Nepal and China.

i. During the meeting held on 25th April 2024 and 2nd May 2024, The Nepal Cabinet approved to re-design the Rs 100 banknote and replace the old map printed in the background of the note.

ii. In 2020, Nepal updated its political map by incorporating 3 strategically important areas Lipulekh, Kalapani and Limpiyadhura areas by amending its Constitution.

iii. India called this a “unilateral act” and termed it as “untenable” the “artificial enlargement” of the territorial claims by Nepal and Nepal has claimed that these territories were illegitimately occupied by India after the 1962 border war with China.

Note: Nepal shares a border of over 1,850 km with **5 Indian states** – Sikkim, West Bengal, Bihar, Uttar Pradesh and Uttarakhand.

**Background:**

Nepal has asserted its claim based on the **Sugauli Treaty of 1816**. According to the treaty all territories east of the Kali (Mahakali) river, including Limpiyadhura, Kalapani, and Lipulekh, belong to Nepal.

- The Treaty was signed between the East India Company and Guru Gajraj Mishra of Nepal following the Anglo-Nepalese War of 1814–16.
- India, however, has stated that the 1950 Treaty of Peace and Friendship between India and Nepal annulled the Sugauli Treaty.

World's Wealthiest Cities Report 2024 by Henley & Partners: New York Tops

According to the 2024 World's Wealthiest Cities Report published by international wealth migration specialists Henley & Partners, **New York City**, New York, the United States of America (USA) has retained its title as the **Wealthiest City in the World**.

- California's **The Bay Area** (USA) is ranked 2nd followed by **Tokyo**(Japan); **Singapore**(Singapore) and **London**(The United Kingdom-UK) at 3rd, 4th and 5th position respectively.

Key Points:

i. Mumbai (Maharashtra) (24th) and Delhi (37th) were the only Indian cities featured among the top 50 of the 2024 World's Wealthiest Cities Report.

ii. With 11 cities in the Top 50, the USA has emerged as the World's richest country.

iii. Among the Asian countries, China dominates the 2024 list. 5 cities in mainland China, along with Hong Kong (Special Administrative Region-SAR) and Taipei are featured among the top 50.

iv. **Shenzhen (China)** has emerged as the fastest-growing city in terms of number of

millionaires and saw an increase of **140%** in the last 10 years.

India Received over USD 111 Billion in Remittances in 2022: UN's International Organization for Migration(IOM)

On 7th May 2024, United Nations(UN) agency, **International Organization for Migration(IOM)** released the report titled “**World Migration Report 2024**”. The report revealed that India received over USD111 billion in remittances in 2022. Thus, India becomes the 1st country to surpass the USD 100 billion mark.

- International remittances surged by **650%**, from USD 128 billion to USD 831 billion between 2000 and 2022.

Key Highlights:

- Top 5 countries which received highest remittances in 2022: India, Mexico, China, The Philippines, France.**
- India(1st), Pakistan(6th) and Bangladesh(8th)** are among the top 10 recipients of international remittances in the world.
- United States of America(U.S.A.)** is the largest source of destination country for international mobile students.

India Overtakes Japan To Become World's 3rd Largest Solar Power Generator

As per the report “Global Electricity Review 2024” by the international energy analytics agency Ember, in 2023, **India surpassed Japan** to become the world's third-largest producer of solar power, generating 113 Terawatt-hour (TWh) compared to Japan's 110 Terawatt-hour (TWh).

- This marked India's significant rise from being 9th in solar energy deployment in 2015.
- India's solar generation increased 17 times from 0.5% in 2015 to reaching 5.8% in 2023. India's wind generation increased slightly from 2.5% to **4.2%** in 2023.

Highlights:

- India witnessed the **world's fourth-largest increase** in solar generation in 2023, with a growth of 18 terawatt hours (TWh), following China (+156 TWh), the United States (+33 TWh), and Brazil (+22 TWh).
- In terms of installed power capacity, India ranked **5th globally** at 73 Gigawatts (GW), while Japan stood at third place with 83 GW.

- **China** led global solar production in 2023, producing 584 Terawatt-hour (TWh), surpassing the combined output of the United States, Japan, Germany, and India.
- Solar power** accounted for a record 5.5% of global electricity in 2023, Wind power provided a higher share of global electricity, at **7.8%** in 2023.
- Solar** remained the fastest-growing electricity source globally for the **19th consecutive year**, outpacing coal. The global growth in solar generation (+307 TWh, +23%) outpaced wind (+206 TWh, +9.8%).

As of May 2024, solar power constituted 18% of India's installed electricity capacity (442 GW) but only 6.66% of actual production.

India & Iran Signed a Long Term Contract to Operate Chabahar Port in Iran

On 13th May 2024, India and Iran signed a long-term contract of 10 years to operate the Shahid Beheshti Port Terminal at Chabahar Port, Iran. This will boost regional connectivity and trade ties.

- The contract was signed by India Ports Global Limited (IPGL), a wholly-owned subsidiary of India Ports Global Chabahar Free Zone (IPGCFZ) and by Port and Maritime Organisation (PMO), Iran.



Key People: The contract was signed in the presence of Sarbananda Sonowal, Minister of Ports, Shipping and Waterways, Government of India (GoI) and **Mehrdad Bazrpash**, Minister of Roads and Urban Development, Iran.

Key Points:

- As per the contract, IPGL is committed to invest approximately **USD 120 million** in equipping the port.
- India has also offered a credit window of **USD 250 million** for mutually identified projects aimed at enhancing Chabahar-related infrastructure.

Background:

- An inter-Governmental memorandum of understanding (MoU) for the development of the Chabahar port by India was signed in May 2015.
- The contract was executed in May 2016 during the visit of Prime Minister (PM) Narendra Modi to Iran.
- India took up the development of the Shahid Beheshti terminal under a tripartite agreement (Chabahar Agreement) on Chabahar signed with Iran and Afghanistan in May 2016.

About Chabahar Port Project:

- Chabahar Port is a deep water port located in the Sistan-Baluchistan province in South Eastern Iran. It consists of 2 important ports i.e. **Shahid Kalantari** and **Shahid Beheshti**.
- It is a flagship project of India and Iran that aims to serve as an vital transit port for trade with Afghanistan and Central Asian countries which are land-locked countries.

- Chabahar Port holds great significance for India as it provides shorter and viable route through which India can easily bypass Pakistan and can trade smoothly with Central Asian countries.

iii. Chabahar Port as a key hub for the International North-South Transport Corridor (INSTC) project. INSTC is a 72,00 km-long multi-mode transport project for moving freight among India, Iran, Afghanistan, Russia, Central Asia and Europe.

India's Ramcharitmanas, Panchatantra and Sahridayaloka –Locana Included in UNESCO's Memory of the World (MOW) Register

United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organisation (UNESCO) has included: **The Ramcharitmanas (Ramacaritamānasa)**, **Panchatantra (Pañcatantra Fables)** and **Sahridayaloka-Locana** in its "Memory of the World (MOW) Asia-Pacific Regional Register".

- The inclusion of these literary works was made at 10th meeting of the Memory of the World Committee for Asia and the Pacific (**MOWCAP**) in Ulaanbatar, Mongolia.
- The Asia-Pacific Member States newly inscribed 20 items from different countries (including 3 from India) during the 2024 cycle.

Key Points:

i.The Ramcharitmanas, Panchatantra and Sahrdayāloka-Locana were authored by Goswami Tulsidas, Pt. Vishnu Sharma and Acharya Anandvardhan respectively.

ii.The Indira Gandhi National Centre for the Arts (**IGNCA**) played a significant role in ensuring the placement of these historic literary works in UNESCO's Memory of the World Asia-Pacific Regional Register.

- These 3 entries from India were successfully represented by **Prof. Ramesh Chandra Gaur**, Dean (Administration) and Head of Department (HOD), Kala Nidhi Division at IGNCA, New Delhi, Delhi.

iii.The event was attended by **38 representatives from member states** convened alongside **40 observers** and nominees.

About Memory of the World Committee for Asia and Pacific (MOWCAP):

i.It is a regional forum for UNESCO's Memory of the World Programme (MOW) which was launched in 1992.

- It also maintains an Asia-Pacific register of the MOW documentary heritage. Inscriptions on the Asia-Pacific Register are made in every 2 years.

ii.MOWCAP was formally established in 1998 during its 1st MOWCAP General Meeting held in Beijing, China.

iii.It has total **43 countries** from the Asia-Pacific region.

Japan Launches World's First 6G Device, 20 Times Faster Than 5G

Japan has launched the **world's first high-speed 6G prototype device**, with data transmission rate of 100 gigabits per second (Gbps), **20 times faster** than the Gold Standard 5G technology.

i.The 6G device offers services covering an impressive range of 300 feet, showcasing the potential for a significant advancement in internet technology.

ii.This was developed by the joint effort by Japan's leading telecom companies, including NTT DOCOMO, Nippon Telegraph and Telephone (NTT) Corporation, NEC Corporation India Private Limited, and Fujitsu.

iii.The 6G technology has the potential to provide **real-time holographic** communication as well as immersive virtual and mixed reality experiences.

NASA Plans to Build 'FLOAT', the 1st Railway System on Moon

National Aeronautics and Space Administration (**NASA**) has announced its plan to build 1st Railway System on Moon, and named as "**Flexible Levitation on a Track (FLOAT)**". This Railway system is part of NASA's Moon to Mars mission i.e. Robotic Lunar Surface Operations 2 (**RLSO2**).

- It will play a vital role in the daily operations of a sustainable lunar base envisioned for 2030s.

- The FLOAT system will be developed by NASA's **Jet Propulsion Laboratory (JPL)** in California, United States of America(U.S.A.)

Key Features of FLOAT system:

i.It will use unpowered robots which would levitate a **3-layer flexible film** track to prevent abrasion from dust on lunar surface.

ii.Name of these 3-layers are:

- A **Graphite Layer** that enables robots to float over tracks using diamagnetic levitation passively.
- A **Flex-Circuit Layer** generates electromagnetic thrust to controllably propel robots along tracks.
- An **Optional thin-film solar panel Layer** generates power for the base when in sunlight.

iii.Carts will be mounted on these robots and will move at the speed of **1.61 kilometer per hour (Km/hr)**.

iv.The system aims to transport approximately **100 tons of material per day** to and from NASA's future lunar base.

- India is ranked highest in South Asia and among the lower-middle-income economies. India was ranked 54th in TTDI 2021 with a score of 4.1.

ii. It was launched by Prime Minister (PM) of India, **Narendra Modi** and the former President of France, **Francois Hollande** on 30th November, 2015 at 21st Conference of Parties (CoP21) to United Nations Framework Convention on Climate

WSJ Report: Indian-Origin Nikesh Arora Became the 2nd Highest-Paid CEO in the US for 2023

According to the Wall Street Journal (WSJ)'s list of the **highest-paid** Chief Executive Officers (CEOs) in the United States of America (USA) for **2023**. **Indian-origin Nikesh Arora**, chairman and CEO of **Palo Alto Networks** became the world's **2nd highest-paid CEO in 2023** with a substantial remuneration of USD 151.43 million (approximately Rs 1,260 crore).

- **Hock E. Tan**, President and CEO of **Broadcom Inc.**, is the **world's highest-paid CEO** with a pay package of USD 161.83 million in 2023.
- **Stephen A. Schwarzman**, Chairman, CEO, and Co-Founder of **Blackstone**, secured the **3rd spot** with a package of USD 119.78 million in 2023.

Analysis of CEO Compensation:

i. WSJ's analysis ranked 415 CEOs of S&P 500 companies, by their total compensation, which included cash and equity awards.

ii. CEO compensation rose year-over-year (y-o-y), with the median amount increasing by more than 8% to USD 15.7 million in 2023.

Note: The S&P 500 saw significant growth, jumping nearly 12% from the start of the year and over 26% over the past 12 months.

THE Asia University Rankings 2024: IISc Topped among Indian Institutes; China's Tsinghua University Tops

i. According to the 12th edition of Times Higher Education's (**THE**) Asia University Rankings (2024), Indian Institute of Science (**IISc**), Bengaluru (Karnataka), ranked 32nd on the list, is the highest ranked Indian institution. The 2024 list features a total of **91 Indian institutions**.

IAF Received 2nd C-295 Transport Aircraft from Airbus Defence and Space

The Indian Air Force (IAF) received its second **C-295** transport aircraft from **Airbus Defence and Space S.A.**, Spain. C-295 aircraft will replace **Avro** Hawker Siddeley HS-748 aircraft in IAF service since 1960.

Note: 1st C-295 transport aircraft was formally inducted into IAF in September, 2023.

About C-295:

- i. It has a capacity of lifting 9 tonnes and can transport up to 71 troopers or paratroopers and goes with a maximum speed of 480 km/hr.
- ii. The rear ramp door of the aircraft can be used for quick reaction and para-dropping of troops and cargo.
- iii. It can operate from Advanced Landing Grounds (**ALGs**) and even on unprepared runways.
- iv. It has flight endurance of up to 11 hours, can carry out multi-role operations like: in disaster response and maritime patrol duties under all weather conditions.
- v. It is also equipped with a radar warning receiver (RWR), Missile Approach Warning System (MAWS), and a laser warning system (LWS).



Background:

- i. In September 2021, Ministry of Defence (MoD), Government of India (GoI) signed an agreement worth **Rs 21,935 crore** with Airbus Defence and Space S.A., Spain for the procurement of 56 C-295 transport aircrafts in order to replace IAF's Avro fleet aircraft.
- ii. As per the agreement, 16 aircrafts will be manufactured at the Airbus facility in Seville, Spain.
- iii. Tata Advanced Systems Limited (TASL), strategic Aerospace and Defence arm of Tata Group in partnership with Airbus Defence and Space will manufacture remaining 40 C-295 aircrafts in the C-295 Fine Assembly Line (FAL) in Vadodara, Gujarat.

- The 1st aircraft manufactured in India will be rolled out in 2026.

Note: Prime Minister (PM) Narendra Modi laid the foundation stone of C-295 FAL in Gujarat on 30th October, 2022.

IA Western Command & IAF conducted Joint Ex- Gagan Strike-II in Punjab

On May 7, 2024, the Ambala, Haryana-based Kharga Corps, under the Indian Army (IA)'s Western Command, and the Indian Air Force (IAF) concluded **Gagan Strike-II**, a three-day Joint Exercise across multiple locations in Punjab.

- The exercise was reviewed by Lieutenant General (Lt Gen) **Manoj Kumar Katiyar**, General Officer Commanding-in-Chief of the Western Command.

- The exercise aimed to refine processes and validate the use of attack helicopters in mechanized operations in developed terrain.

Key Points:

i. Gagan Strike-II involved **Apache** and Advanced Light Helicopter-Weapon System Integrated (ALH-WSI), unarmed aerial vehicles, and Army Special Forces.

ii. The exercise focused on validating attack helicopter deployment in support of mechanized operations.

- Live firing exercises were conducted during offensive maneuvers.

iii. Centralized and decentralized attack helicopter missions were practiced, supported by other force multipliers.

iv. Ground force commanders utilized aerial assets, including drones, for enhanced situational awareness and target destruction.

v. The exercise facilitated seamless integration of ground and aerial assets for joint operations, achieving specified objectives.

7th India-France Joint Military “Ex-SHAKTI” 2024 Commences in Meghalaya

The 7th India-France joint military “**Exercise SHAKTI 2024**” commenced on 13th May, 2024 at **Umroi**, in a fully developed and modern Foreign Training Node in **Meghalaya**. Ex-SHAKTI is a **biennial** training exercise which is conducted alternatively in India and France.



- The 14-day joint exercise is scheduled to be conducted from **13th May to 26th May, 2024**.

- The joint exercise will focus on operations in the semi-urban and mountainous terrain.

Key Participants:

i. Indian contingent is being represented mainly by a battalion of **RAJPUT Regiment**, consists of 90 personnel. Observers from Indian Air Force and Indian Navy will also participate in the exercise.

ii. French contingent will be represented mainly by personnel from 13th Foreign Legion Half-Brigade (**13th DBLE**). It also consists of 90 personnel.

Key Highlights:

i. The exercise aims to improve joint military capability of both countries to undertake multi-domain operations in a Sub-Conventional scenario under Chapter-VII of the UN mandate.

ii. The joint exercise will conduct tactical drills which include: response to a terrorist act of capturing a defined territory, establishment of a Joint Command Post, Establishment of an Intelligence and Surveillance Centre, among others.

Significance: This joint EX-SHAKTI will enable the both countries to share their best practices in Tactics, Techniques and Procedures of Joint Operations. It will facilitate developing interoperability between Armed Forces of the two countries.

Note: The 6th edition of Ex-SHAKTI was held at Military School of Draguignan, France in November, 2021.

iii. The training covered close-quarter battles, building intervention drills, hostage rescue operations, surveillance, long-range sniping, and planning complex operations involving multiple targets.

DRDO Successfully Conducted the Flight-test of RudraM-II Air-to-Surface Missile from Su-30 MK-I off the Odisha Coast

On 29th May 2024, Defence Research and Development Organisation (**DRDO**) successfully conducted the flight-test of **RudraM-II**, Next Generation Anti-Radiation Missile(NGARM) from **Su-30 MK-I** fighter jet of the Indian Air Force (**IAF**). This air-to-surface missile was tested at Integrated Test Range (**ITR**), Balasore, Off the Coast of Odisha.



- It is the latest version of **RudraM – 1 missile**, 1st indigenously developed anti radiation air-to-surface missile was test-fired from **Su-30MKI** fighter jet in **2020**.

About RudraM–II Missile:

i.It is an indigenously developed solid propelled air-launched missile system for air-to-surface to neutralise various types of enemy assets. It can carry a payload of **200 kg** and attain a maximum speed of **6,791 km/h (Mach 5.5)**.

ii.This missile system will replace **Russian Kh-31**, anti-radiation missiles currently deployed in Indian defence system.

Indian Army unveiled Tractor-Mounted ATGM System in “Jugaad Innovation”

Indian Army has unveiled an Anti-Tank Guided Missile(ATGM) system mounted on a farm tractor. This “**Jugaad**” (Hindi for ingenious improvisation) innovation is named as **Improvised Tractor Mounted ATGM**.

ACC Appoints Sanjaya Kumar Mishra as President of GSTAT

The Appointment Committee of the Cabinet (ACC) has approved the appointment of **Sanjaya Kumar Mishra**, the former Chief Justice (CJ) of the High Court (HC) of Jharkhand, as the **President** of Goods and Services Tax Appellate Tribunal (GSTAT).

- He will hold the post for 4 years from the date of his assuming charge or till attaining the age of 70 years, whichever is earlier.

Centre approves appointment of Sanjaya Kumar Mishra as President, GSTAT



About GSTAT:

i. The Government of India established the GSTAT to facilitate the resolution of disputes within the business sector. GSTAT aims to commence the operations from 1st July 2024.

- It is the forum of the second appeal in GST laws and the first common forum of dispute resolution between the Centre and States.

ii. GSTAT will comprise one Principal Bench in Delhi to handle inter-state disputes; and 31 State benches to take up all other issues, including rates across various locations nationwide.

- Uttar Pradesh(UP) will have 3 Benches, the highest in any given State in India.

iii. It is a specialised body to handle GST-related disputes efficiently and is vital for providing impartial, expert, and efficient resolution mechanisms.

About Sanjaya Kumar Mishra:

i. In 1988, he started practice in Balangir District Courts and joined as an Additional District & Sessions Judge in Jeypore, Odisha in 1999.

ii. He also worked as District & Sessions Judge in Sundergarh, Dhenkanal in Odisha; Special Judge (Central Bureau of Investigation/CBI) in Bhubaneswar, Odisha; and Registrar General of Odisha HC.

William Lai Ching-te Sworn in as 16th President of Taiwan; Bi-khim Hsiao Took Oath as Vice President

Dr William Lai Ching-te, a doctor turned politician was sworn in as the **16th President of Taiwan** (Republic of China (ROC)) in a ceremony held at the presidential office in Taipei. The First Lady and **Vice President Bi-khim Hsiao** also attended the inaugural celebrations.

- **William Lai Ching-te** succeeded **Tsai Ing-wen**, the **1st** female head of state of **Taiwan** and **Asia**, who served as president for 2 consecutive 4-year terms since 2016.
- **Bi-khim Hsiao** succeeded **Lai Ching-te** as the 16th Vice President of Taiwan.

About Dr William Lai Ching-te:

i.In 1994 he was a chief resident at the National Cheng Kung University Hospital and in 1996, during the Taiwan Strait Crisis, he left his medical career to enter politics.

ii. In 1998, he was elected to the Legislative Yuan representing Tainan City and was elected to the legislature for 4 consecutive terms (1999-2010).

iii. In 2010, he was elected as the 1st mayor of Tainan Special Municipality (a merger of Tainan County and Tainan City).

iv. He served as Taiwan's premier from 2017 to 2019. In 2020, he was officially sworn in as the 15th-term Vice President of Taiwan (May 2020 to May 2024).

v. In 2023, he began serving as the Democratic Progressive Party (DPP) chairperson.

About Bi-khim Hsiao:

i. She began her political career as program coordinator for the DPP's US mission in 1995.

- She became the deputy director of its Department of International Affairs in 1996, and director from 1997 to 2006.

ii. In 2000, she served as an advisor in Taiwan's Presidential Office and as secretary, and interpreter for the president.

iii. In 2001, she served as a representative at-large for the DPP and was a member of the 5th, 6th, 8th, and 9th Legislative Yuan.

iv. In 2020, she served as senior advisor to the National Security Council and was appointed as representative of Taiwan to the US.

WEF Founder Klaus Schwab To Step Back From Executive Role

Klaus Schwab, Founder and Executive Chairman of the World Economic Forum (WEF), will be stepping down from executive role and transition to non-executive role by **January 2025**.

- He will transition from Executive Chairman to Chairman of the Board of Trustees.

i. Klaus Martin Schwab is a German mechanical engineer and economist who founded World Economic Forum (WEF) (formerly known as European Management Forum), non-profit organisation which aims to improve the states of the world, in 1971.

ii. He served as a Professor of Business Policy at the University of Geneva, Switzerland from 1972 to 2003 and has been a Honorary Professor, University of Geneva since 2003.

iii. He has also served as a member of the United Nations (UN) High-Level Advisory Board on Sustainable Development from 1993 to 1995 and Vice-Chairman of the UN Committee for Development Planning from 1996-1998.

iv. In 1998, he co-founded the Schwab Foundation for Social Entrepreneurship with his wife Hilde Schwab to promote social entrepreneurship and innovation.

v. In 1970, he wrote the book 'Modern Management', conceptualizing stakeholder capitalism.

Additional info:

i. WEF is undergoing a governance evolution from a founder-managed organisation to one led by a president and the managing board to take full executive responsibility.

ii. At present, WEF is guided by a Board of Trustees, who oversees the WEF's work in promoting global citizenship.

iii. The Managing Board of WEF, chaired by **Børge Brende, President of WEF**, acts as its executive body.

Background:

The Ministry of Defence (MoD) has set up a nine-member panel headed by former principal scientific advisor **Prof. K. Vijay Raghavan** to revamp the Defence Research and Development Organisation (DRDO). The panel had submitted its report, 'Redefining Defence Research and Development', in early January. But its implementation has been stuck as higher-ups in the DRDO have opposed some of the structural changes suggested.

- For this purpose, the government of India has set up an **Overseeing Committee** headed by **Dr Kamat** and has two senior director generals of the DRDO.
- To ensure the continuity in the reform process underway in DRDO, the government has extended the term of Dr Kamat by one year.

i.Samir V Kamat joined DRDO at Defence Metallurgical Research Laboratory (DMRL),

Hyderabad, as **Scientist 'C'** in 1989 and rose to the position of the Director of the lab in 2015.

ii.On-field earnings include prize money, salaries, bonuses, and, for soccer, club-based image rights agreements.

iv.The 2024 list does not features any women athletes. In 2023 Serena Williams was the only woman among the world's highest-paid athletes, since she retired in 2023, she is no longer eligible. No women made the list from 2017 to 2019.

Sela Tunnel of Arunachal Pradesh Recognised as India's Highest Tunnel by International Book of Honour

Arunachal Pradesh's Sela Tunnel, an engineering marvel has been recognised as **India's Highest Tunnel** by the **International Book of Honour (IBH)**, England, United Kingdom (UK). This recognition underscores the achievement of the Border Road Organisation (BRO) in constructing the tunnel at an altitude of 13,000 feet through Project VARTAK with construction carried out by Patel Engineering Limited.



- Sela Tunnel is the world's longest bi-lane tunnel constructed on the road connecting Tezpur, Assam to Tawang in the West Kameng district of Arunachal Pradesh.

Points to Note:

The 2.598 km-long Sela Tunnel on Tezpur-Tawang Road ensures year-long connectivity to the strategic Tawang Region.

Note: Tawang is located 448 km northwest of Itanagar (capital city of Arunachal Pradesh) and is close to the Chinese border in the northeast.

Key Features:

- Constructed at a cost of Rs 825 crore, the tunnel ensures all-weather connectivity along the National Highway (NH)-13 road to Tawang via **Sela Pass** on the Balipara – Chariduar – Tawang Road.
- It bolsters the Armed Forces' preparedness and fosters socio-economic development in the border region.
- It has been constructed using the **Austrian Tunnelling Method** and adheres to the highest safety standards.
- The project comprises 2 tunnels and an interconnecting road.

- Tunnel 1 is a 980-meter-long single-tube tunnel, while Tunnel 2 is a 1,555-meter-long twin-tube tunnel.

v. The link road connecting these tunnels spans a distance of 1,200 meters.

Background:

Prime Minister (PM) Narendra Modi virtually inaugurated the Sela Tunnel project during the Viksit Bharat Viksit North East programme in Itanagar, Arunachal Pradesh on March 09, 2024.

- The award is given in recognition of his contributions to time-domain astronomy culminated in the conception, construction and leadership of the Palomar Transient Facility (**PTF**) and its successor, the Zwicky Transient Facility (**ZTF**). These discoveries help to better understand time-variable optical sky.

- i. He was born in **1956** in **Maharashtra, India** and he is the brother of renowned Indian Philanthropist and Padma Bhushan Awardee, **Sudha Murthy**.

Mumbai City Beats Mohun Bagan 3-1 to Win the Indian Super League 2023-24 Final

Mumbai City Football Club (MCFC) beat Mohun Bagan SuperGiants (MBSG) 3-1 to win the **10th** edition of the **Indian Super League (ISL)** 2023-24 final at the Vivekananda Yuba Bharati Krirangan (Salt Lake Stadium) in Kolkata, West Bengal(WB).

- This is the second ISL title for Mumbai City Football Club, it previously won the 2020-21 season against Atlético de Kolkata Mohun Bagan.
- A total of **12 clubs** participated in the Indian Super League 2023-24.

Magnus Carlsen Wins the 2024 Superbet Poland Rapid & Blitz; Praggnanandhaa Finishes Fourth

The Five-time World Champion & World No. 1 **Magnus Carlsen** emerged as the winner of the **2024 Superbet Poland Rapid & Blitz**, a part of World Chess Tour that was held from 7th to 12th May 2024 in Warsaw, Poland.

- The Norwegian chess player gained a total of 26 points to clinch the title after a total of 10 wins in a row.

Note– The prize fund for each of the two tournaments will be **USD 350,000** and **USD 175,000** per event for rapid and blitz. In addition, a bonus prize fund worth USD 275,000 will be awarded.

- Magnus received the prize money of USD 40,000.

Key Highlights:

- Wei Yi** of China clinched the second spot with 25.5 points.
- Jan-Krzysztof Duda** of Poland finished third with 19.5 points and **Praggnanandhaa** claimed the fourth position in the tournament with 19 points.
- Erigaisi Arjun** finished fifth while **Dommaraju Gukesh** finished at 10th position.

About Magnus Carlsen:

- Apart from winning the 2024 Superbet Poland Rapid & Blitz, Magnus Carlsen has lately won the GRENKE Chess Classic 2024 (Karlsruhe, Germany) in March & April for the third time after winning it in 2015 and 2019.
- Besides, he has also claimed the 2024 Champions Chess Tour Chessable Masters title in February 2024.

About Grand Chess Tour 2024:

- The Grand Chess Tour is a multi-level chess competition spread out over the year and

across formats, where the top players in the world compete with each other.

ii. The tournament began in 2015 as a three-legged competition, with Magnus Carlsen emerging as the winner.

Indian Javelin Thrower Neeraj Chopra finished second at the Doha Diamond League 2024

The Olympic and World Champion javelin thrower **Neeraj Chopra** claimed the **second** spot in the **Doha Diamond League 2024** that was held on 10th May 2024 at the Qatar Sports Club, Doha, Qatar.

- The three-time Olympian for Czech Republic Jakub Vadlejch claimed the top spot with 88.38 meters throw while Neeraj Chopra missed the first spot by just 2 centimeters (88.36 meters).



Key Highlights:

i. The former world champion Anderson Peters of Grenada claimed the third spot with an 86.62m throw.

ii. Meanwhile, India's Kishore Jena, who claimed the silver medal at the Hangzhou 2022 Asian Games held in China in 2023, finished ninth in his Diamond League debut.

Note– The next men's javelin Diamond League meeting will be held in **Paris** on July 7, 2024.

About Neeraj Chopra:

i. Neeraj Chopra had won the 2023 Doha Diamond League.

ii. He has clinched a gold medal at the 19th Asian Games taking place in China's Hangzhou.

iii. Besides, he has also claimed a gold medal in the men's javelin throw event at the World Athletics Championships 2023 in Budapest, Hungary.

iv. He is also the 2020 Tokyo Olympic (Japan) gold medalist.

About the Diamond League:

i. The Diamond League is a high-level multi-tier group of track & field meets conducted under the World Athletics (formerly known as IAAF or International Association of Athletics Federations).

ii. The 2024 Diamond League is the fifteenth season of the annual series of outdoor track and field meetings.

Neeraj Chopra Wins Gold Medal in 27th National Federation Senior Athletics Competition 2024

2020 Tokyo Olympics Gold medalist Neeraj Chopra won the **Gold medal** in the men's Javelin with **82.27 meter(m)** throw in 27th National Federation Senior Athletics Competition 2024. The tournament held at **Kalinga Stadium** in Bhubaneswar, Odisha.

- This was the first time for Neeraj Chopra from Haryana to participate in an event in India in three years. Last time, he competed at the Federation Cup in 2021 and won a gold medal with an 87.80 m throw.
- **DP Manu** from Karnataka won the **Silver** medal with 82.06m throw and **Uttam Balasaheb Patil** from Maharashtra won the Bronze medal with 78.39m.

PUMA India signed with AFI to Become Official Kit Sponsor of Indian Athletes

PUMA India has signed a multi-year deal with the Athletics Federation of India (AFI) to become its **official kit sponsor**, aiming to enhance athlete performance and create excellence within India's sporting community.

i. Under this partnership, Puma will provide performance kits, speed suits and travel gear to every athlete under AFI representing India in track & field, jumps, throws, cross country running and marathons at both domestic and international tournaments.

ii. This is the **first time** that Indian athletes get access to speed suits that PUMA supplies globally to other athletes.

iii. Puma will equip over **400 athletes** with products comprising apparel, footwear and accessories.

- International sports stars like Neeraj Chopra (javelin throw), Kishore Kumar Jena (javelin throw), Parul Chaudhary (steeplechase), Subha Venkatesan (4x 400 meter relay), Murali Sreeshankar (long jump), Jyothi Yarraji (hurdle), Priyanka Goswami (race walk) and Jeswin Aldrin (long jump) will benefit from PUMA's gear across sporting events.

iv. This partnership does not include the **Olympics, Asian Games and Commonwealth Games**.

Note: AFI established in 1946, is the apex body for running and managing athletics in India. It is affiliated with the **World Athletics**, Asian Athletics Association (AAA), and Indian Olympic Association (IOA).

Satwiksairaj Rankireddy and Chirag Shetty won the doubles title in BWF Thailand Open 2024

Indian shuttlers Satwiksairaj Rankireddy and Chirag Shetty have won the men's doubles title in the Badminton World Federation (BWF) **Thailand Open Super 500** badminton tournament 2024 which was held from 14th to 19th May 2024 in Bangkok, Thailand.

- The world No. 3 Indian pair clinched the title by defeating the 29th-ranked Chen Bo Yang and Liu Yi of China.
- This was their second tournament win of 2024 and **second** Thailand Open title after winning it in 2019.

Note– The victory made the Indian pair earn 9200 ranking points and prize money of USD 33180.

Achievements of Satwiksairaj Rankireddy and Chirag Shetty:

i. On the whole, this was Satwik and Chirag's eighth title in the Badminton World Federation (BWF) World Tour.

ii. The Indian duo won the Swiss Open, the Indonesia Open and the Korea Open in 2023 as well as won the French Open Super 750 in March 2024.

Key Highlights of the tournament:

i. Malaysia's **Lee Zii Jia** won the Men's Singles title defeating Hong Kong's Ng Ka Long Angus to claim his second Thailand Open Title after winning in 2022.

ii. In the Women's Singles, Thailand's **Supanida Katethong** won the Women's Singles title by defeating China's Han Yue which became her first Super 500 tournament win.

About BWF Thailand Open 2024:

- i. The Thailand Open (officially known as Toyota Thailand Open) is a part of the BWF World Tour Super 500 marks the first BWF World Tour tournament since the Spain Masters 2024 which was held at the end of March.
- ii. It was held in 1984 for the first time and is now the 36th edition of the Thailand Open.
- iii. The Thailand Open 2024 offers a prize money pool of USD 420,000.

Brazil Declared Host of FIFA Women's World Cup 2027

International Federation of Association Football (**FIFA**) President Gianni Infantino announced **Brazil** as the host for the 10th edition of FIFA Women's World Cup (**FIFAWWC**) **2027** during the 74th FIFA Congress in Bangkok, Thailand.

- Brazil became the **1st South American** country to hold the Women's World Cup, beating the joint bid of Belgium, Netherlands and Germany (BNG).
 - Brazil hosted the men's football World Cups twice in 1950 and 2014.
- ii. Spain emerged as the winner of 2023 edition held in Australia and New Zealand.
 - iii. The United States Women's National Soccer Team (USWNT) leads with 4 titles in 1991, 1999, 2015, and 2019.

Magnus Carlsen Won the Casablanca Chess Tournament 2024; Anand Secured 3rd Position

Five-time World Champion & World No. 1 Chess player **Magnus Carlsen** won the inaugural Casablanca Chess Variant Tournament 2024 that was held on 18th-19th May, 2024 at **Mahkama du Pacha** in Casablanca, Morocco.

- Magnus Carlsen from Norway, finished the 4-player event with 4.5 points from 6 rounds.
- The tournament featured 4 distinguished players who represented 4 different continents i.e. Vishwanathan Anand (**Asia**), Bassem Amin (**Africa**), Hikaru Nakamura (**America**) and Magnus Carlsen (**Europe**).
- **Hikaru Nakamura** from United States of America (U.S.A.) secured 2nd position with 3.5 points.
- 5-time World Champion and Indian Chess Player, **Vishwanathan Anand** secured the 3rd position with 3 points.

Malaysia Masters 2024 – PV Sindhu finishes runner-up in the Women's Singles; Viktor Axelsen wins the Men's Singles title

Two-time Olympic gold medalist and World number 15, Pusarla Venkata (**P.V**) **Sindhu** settles as runner-up in the Women's Singles category after losing the match to World number 7, **Wang Zhi Yi of China** in the Badminton World Federation (BWF) Malaysia Masters 2024 held from 21st to 26th May 2024 in Axiata Arena, Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia.

- Meanwhile, World number 1 **Viktor Axelsen** won his first World Tour title of 2024 in the Men's Singles category after defeating Malaysian badminton player Lee Zii Jia.

Note– The total prize money set for the Malaysia Masters 2024 BWF Super 500 badminton tournament is USD 4,20,000.

About P.V Sindhu :

i.P.V Sindhu has won the Singapore Open and Commonwealth Games (Birmingham) in 2022.

ii.P.V Sindhu has captured the women's singles title in the competition twice in 2013 and 2016, while Saina Nehwal secured the title in 2017.

iii.She also finished as a runner up at the Madrid Spain Masters in 2023.

About Malaysia Masters 2024 :

i.The 2024 Malaysia Masters 2024 was the 13th tournament on the BWF World Tour 2024.

ii.It commenced in 2009 wherein the Badminton World Federation (BWF) had previously categorized the event as a Grand Prix Gold tournament. However, from 2018, it has been classified as a BWF World Tour Super 500 tournament.

About Badminton World Federation (BWF):

President – Poul-Erik Høyer Larsen

Headquarters – Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia.

Indian Premier League 2024: Kolkata Knight Riders won the championship defeating Sunrisers Hyderabad

Kolkata Knight Riders(KKR) captained by Shreyas Iyer(Indian cricketer) has won the champions title of the 17th season of the Indian Premier League (IPL 2024) by defeating Sunrisers Hyderabad(SRH) captained by Pat Cummins(Australian cricketer) by eight wickets in the finals held at the MA Chidambaram Stadium, Chennai, Tamil Nadu(TN).

- This marks KKR's 3rd IPL title. The team has previously won the title in **2012** and **2014** under the captaincy of Gautam Gambhir.
- The finals between KKR and SRH lasted only 29 overs and became the shortest-ever IPL playoff game (without weather interruptions).

About IPL 2024:

i.Title Sponsor: TATA Group has secured the title sponsorship rights of IPL for 5 years (2024 to 2028) for Rs 2500 crore.

ii.The Official Broadcaster of IPL 2024 is Star Sports and the Official digital streaming partner is JioCinema.

Dipa Karmakar Becomes 1st Indian Gymnast to Win Gold Medal at Asian Gymnastics Championships 2024

Dipa Karmakar (from Tripura) has become the **first Indian gymnast** to win a **gold medal** in the women's vault apparatus at the **Asian Gymnastics Championships 2024** (11th Senior Women Artistic Gymnastics Asian Championships) held from 24th to 26th May 2024 in Tashkent, Uzbekistan.

- This is the first time an Indian gymnast has won a gold medal in any event at the Asian Championships. She achieved an average score of 13.566 in the vault final.
- **Kim Son-hyang** and **Jo Kyong-byol** of **North Korea** finished with the silver and bronze medals respectively.



Note: Previously, Indian gymnasts have won 4 bronze medals at the Asian Championships. The 4 bronzes were earned by Dipa Karmakar in women's vault in 2015; Ashish Kumarmen in the floor exercise in 2006, and Pranati Nayak in women's vault in 2019 and 2022.

About Dipa Karmakar:

i. Dipa Karmakar won bronze in the women's vault final at the 2014 Glasgow Commonwealth Games, Scotland. This was her first international medal.

ii. In 2016, She became the first female gymnast from India to compete in the Olympics. She finished 4th at the 2016 Summer Olympics, held in Rio de Janeiro, Brazil.

iii. She won the gold medal at the 2018 International Gymnastics Federation (FIG) Artistic Gymnastics World Cup series held in Mersin, Türkiye and became the first Indian ever to win a gold medal at a global gymnastics event.

- She also won the bronze medal at the 2018 FIG Artistic Gymnastics World Cup series held in Cottbus, Germany.

Formula 1: Ferrari's Charles Leclerc wins Monaco F1 GP 2024

On 26 May 2024, **Ferrari's Charles Leclerc**, a racing driver from **Monaco** won the **Monaco Grand Prix (GP) 2024** (officially Formula 1 (F1) Grand Prix de Monaco 2024) held at Circuit de Monaco in Monte Carlo. This victory is Charles Leclerc's 1st win since the 2022 Austrian GP, breaking a 39-race winless line.

- With this victory, **Charles** became the **1st Monegasque driver** to win the Monaco GP since **Louis Chiron** in 1931.
- **McLaren's Oscar Piastri** of Australia finished **2nd** and **Ferrari's Carlos Sainz** of Spain finished **3rd** in the Monaco GP 2024.

Note: He had never previously finished on the podium at this circuit in F1 or F2.

Points to Note:



i. Charles Leclerc secured his 5th podium finish in the 1st 8 races of the season. This surpasses his previous record of 4 podiums in the 1st 20 races in 2023.

Global Standing:

i. After winning the Monaco GP 2024, **Charles Leclerc** secured **2nd position** in the **World Driver's Championship 2024** standings with **138 points**.

ii. He is 31 points short of **Red Bull's Max Verstappen**, a Dutch-Belgian racer, who **leads** the standings with **169 points**.

- **Lando Norris** (British and Belgium) secured **3rd** with **113 points**.

About Monaco GP:

It is an annual F1 motor racing event, taking place over 78 laps of the 3.337-kilometer (km) Circuit de Monaco in Monte Carlo in the Principality of Monaco.

- Circuit de Monaco is a street circuit laid out on the city streets of Monte Carlo and La Condamine.

ii. It is the shortest race on the calendar.

Obituaries

Former Bihar Deputy CM Sushil Kumar Modi Passed Away

Senior Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) leader and former Bihar Deputy Chief Minister (CM) Sushil Kumar Modi passed away at the age of 72 in New Delhi, Delhi. He was born on 5th January 1952 in Patna, Bihar.

- He became one of the leaders who became a member of the Rajya Sabha, Lok Sabha and both houses of legislature – Bihar Legislative Council and the Bihar Legislative Assembly.

About Sushil Kumar Modi:

i. Sushil Kumar Modi became a Member of Legislative Assembly (MLA) for the first time in 1990 from the Patna Central constituency (presently Kumhrar).

- He served as MLA for 3 terms – 1990-95, 1995-2000, and 2000-2004.
- ii. From 1995 to 1996, he served as Secretary of the BJP and from 1996 to 2004, he was the Leader of Opposition at the Bihar Legislative Assembly.
- iii. He served as the Minister of Parliamentary Affairs of Bihar in 2000.
- iv. He was elected to the 14th Lok Sabha representing Bhagalpur constituency in 2004.
- v. He was later served as a Member of the Bihar Legislative Council from 2006-2012; 2012-2018, and 2018-2020.
- vi. He also served as finance minister of Bihar from 2005-2013 and 2017-2020 and as Deputy CM of Bihar for over 11 years across 2 stints, the 1st from 2005 to 2013, and then from 2017 to 2020.
- vii. In 2020, he was elected to the Rajya Sabha from Bihar. He retired from Rajya Sabha in April 2024.



Former Gujarat Governor & Veteran Congress Leader Kamla Beniwal Passed Away

A veteran Congress leader and former Gujarat Governor Dr Kamla Beniwal has passed away at the age of 97 at a private hospital in Jaipur, Rajasthan. She was born on 12th January 1927 in Jhunjhunu, Rajasthan.

About Kamla Beniwal:

- i. At the age of 15, she joined the Indian National Congress (INC) and participated in the Quit India Movement (1942).
- ii. She began her political career in 1954 and was elected as Member of the Legislative Assembly (MLA) seven times.
- iii. At the age of 27, she became the first woman minister in Rajasthan.
- iv. She served as a member in the All India Congress Committee (AICC), Joint Secretary of the Pradesh Congress Committee (PCC) and President of the Rajasthan Mahila Congress.
- v. She served as the Governor of Tripura from October 2009 to November 2009. She became the first female governor of any state in Northeast India.
- vi. She has also served as the Governor of Gujarat (2009 to 2014) and Mizoram (July 2014 to August 2014) and as Deputy Chief minister of Rajasthan.



vii. Beniwal was awarded the '**Tamra Patra Award**' by then Prime Minister of India, Indira Gandhi.

Padma Awardee and Former Chairman of ICICI Bank, Narayanan Vaghul passed away

Renowned Indian Banker and Former Chairman of ICICI Bank, **Narayanan Vaghul** passed away at the age of 88 in Chennai, Tamil Nadu (T.N.).

Awards:

i. He was awarded the **Padma Bhushan**, India's 3rd highest civilian honour, in 2010 in the Trade and Industry category.

ii. He was honoured with **The Economics Times Lifetime Achievement Award** for his exceptional contribution in the banking industry of India in 2006.

iii. He received Businessman of the Year by **Business India** in 1992.

About Narayanan Vaghul:

i. He started his banking career with the State Bank of India (SBI) as an Officer.

ii. He became the Executive Director of Central Bank of India in **1978**.

iii. He was the youngest person to become the chairman of Bank of India (BOI) in **1981**.

iv. He had also worked as Director of National Institute of Bank Management (NIBM) in Pune, Maharashtra.

v. He was the Chairman of ICICI (then ICICI Limited) from September 1985 to April **2009**.



- He became Chairman of ICICI Bank in 2002 following the merger of ICICI with the Bank.

vi. He was the founder chairman of **CRISIL Limited** (formerly known as Credit Rating Information Services of India Limited), 1st credit rating agency in India.

His Noted Work: In 2023, Union Minister of Finance, Nirmala Sitharaman released his memoir titled "**Reflections**" (published by Piramal Enterprises Limited) which carried vivid account of his experiences spanning over several decades in financial sector of India.

Iran President Ebrahim Raisi Passed away; Mohammad Mokhber Takes Charge as Interim President

On May 19 2024, Iran's **8th President Ebrahim Raisi** died in a helicopter crash in northwestern Iran (Iran-Azerbaijan border), Following his death Iran's 1st Vice President **Mohammad Mokhber** was appointed as **Interim President** of Iran for 50 days (before mandatory presidential elections).

- Iran's government cabinet also appoints Deputy Foreign Minister Ali Bagheri Kani as acting foreign minister after the death of Hossein Amir-Abdollahian in the crash.
- Mohammad Mokhber's elevation to presidential office will be subject to the approval of Supreme Leader **Ayatollah Ali Khamenei**.

Note:

i. According to Iran's constitution, the vice president assumes the presidency if the president dies, is absent, or is incapacitated while in office.

ii. The 1st vice president of Iran is the second most powerful person in the elected branch of government after the president.

About Ebrahim Raisi:

i. Ebrahim Raisi was born on 14 December 1960 and grew up in the northeastern city of Mashhad.

ii. In 1985, he was appointed deputy prosecutor general of Tehran, Iran, and served as prosecutor general of Tehran between 1989 and 1994.

iii. He was named first deputy head of the judiciary from 2004 to 2014. He was Iran's prosecutor general from 2014 to 2016.

iv. He was appointed Iran's chief justice in 2019 and became deputy chief of the Assembly of Experts in 2019.

v. He won Iran's 2021 presidential election with 62% of the vote.

About Mohammad Mokhber:

i. He served as an officer in the Islamic Revolutionary Guard Corps (IRGC) medical corps during the Iran-Iraq War.

ii. Before becoming the deputy governor of the Khuzestan Province, he worked as the Chief Executive Officer (CEO) of Dezful Telecommunications.

iii. He was appointed commercial vice president of the Mostazafan Foundation and later served as the chairman of Sina Bank's board of directors for around 10 years.

iv. He was appointed the 1st Vice President of Iran in August 2021, after the now-deceased President Raisi chose him as his deputy.

Important Days with theme

International Workers' Day 2024 – May 01

International Workers' Day (also known as International Labour Day) is annually observed across the globe on **1 May** to promote worker's rights and honour the contribution of workers in every industry and field to society.

- The Day aims to pay tribute to the struggle of workers for their rights and decent working conditions.

History of May Day:

- The origins of May Day can be traced back to the 1886 Haymarket Massacre (aka Haymarket Riot) violent confrontation between police and labor protesters in Chicago, Illinois, the United States of America (USA) on 4th May 1886.
- The riot occurred during a peaceful labor demonstration in support of an eight-hour workday.
- In 1889, The Second International, an organisation of socialist and labour parties, announced that May 1 would be marked as International Workers' Day.



World Press Freedom Day 2024 – May 3

The United Nations (UN)'s **World Press Freedom Day** is annually observed across the globe on **3rd May** to celebrate the fundamental principles of press freedom and evaluate press freedom worldwide.

- **3rd May 2024** marks the **31st** anniversary of World Press Freedom Day.
- The celebration of World Press Freedom Day is led by the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization (UNESCO).
- 2024 theme: **“A Press for the Planet: Journalism is the Face of the environmental crisis”**.

The **Palestinian journalist covering Gaza** have been named the laureates of the **2024 UNESCO/Guillermo Cano World Press Freedom Prize**. The Award Ceremony was held on 2 May 2024 during the World Press Freedom Conference in Santiago, Chile.

65th Border Roads Organisation Raising Day – 7 May 2024

The **Border Roads Organisation (BRO)** annually celebrates its **Raising Day on 7 May** to commemorate the establishment of the BRO in **1960**. The Day aims to recognise the organisations' personnel and invite all ranks to continue to excel in constructing and maintaining roads and bridges in the border area.



- **7th May 2024** marks the observance of the **65th Raising Day of BRO**.

Background:

i. BRO was established on 7th May 1960 to secure India's borders and develop infrastructure in remote areas of the north and northeast Indian states.

ii. On 14th March 1960, the Union Cabinet decided to constitute the Border Roads Development Board (BRDB), under the chairmanship of the Prime Minister.

iii. The BRDB was constituted to coordinate and implement road projects for development and to meet the Defence needs.

- The BRDB was re-constituted in 1985 with the Defence Minister as the chairman.

About Border Roads Organisation (BRO):

Headquarters– New Delhi, Delhi

World Athletics Day 2024 – May 7

- The annual observance is led by the **World Athletics**.
- The theme for World Athletics Day 2024 is “**World Mile Challenge**”.

Background:

i. The IAAF, the world governing body for the sport of track and field athletics, introduced World Athletics Day as a social responsibility titled “Athletics for a Better World.”

ii. The 1st ever World Athletics Day was observed on 15th May 1996.

Kids' Athletics Day 2024 – 7th May

Kids' Athletics Day is annually observed across the globe on 7th May to encourage children and young people to play sports, especially athletics.

Kids' Athletics Day is an important feature of the **World Athletics' Kids' Athletics programme**,

About World Athletics:

World Athletics (or IAAF) was established on 17 July 1912, in Stockholm, Sweden, following the Olympic Games closing ceremony.

World Red Cross and Red Crescent Day 2024 – May 8

World Red Cross and Red Crescent Day is annually observed across the globe on **8th May** to honour and thank the volunteers and staff of the International Red Cross and Red Crescent Movement.

- The day also celebrates the principles of the International Red Cross and Red Crescent Movement.

The **theme** of World Red Cross and Red Crescent Day 2024 is “**Keeping Humanity Alive**”.

Background:

i. During the 14th International Conference of the Red Cross held in London, England, in 1938, the delegates decided to observe 8th May of every year as the International Red Cross Day.

ii. The 1st ‘International Red Cross Day,’ was celebrated on May 8, 1948.

iii. The official title of the day changed over time and became known as ‘World Red Cross and Red Crescent Day’ in 1984.

National Technology Day 2024 – May 11

National Technology Day is annually observed across India on **11 May** to honour the remarkable achievements of the nation’s scientists, engineers, innovators, and others involved in the field of Science and Technology, and celebrate and recognise the major technological advancements of India.

- This Day also commemorates the anniversary of the successful nuclear test (Pokhran II) in Pokhran, Rajasthan under the assigned code name Operation Shakti in 1998.

11 May 2024 marks the **26th year** of National Technology Day.

- The theme for this annual event is chosen by the Technology Development Board (TDB) under the Department of Science and Technology (DST).
- The 2024 event was celebrated under the theme, **Promoting Clean and Green Technologies for a Sustainable Future**‘.

Background:

i. The then Prime Minister of India, Atal Bihari Vajpayee designated the 11 May of every year as the National Technology Day in 1998, to commemorate the Pokhran II nuclear tests conducted by the Indian Army.

ii. The Council for Technology organised the 1st National Technology Day on 11 May 1999.

International Nurses Day 2024 – May 12

International Nurses Day (IND) is annually observed across the globe on **12th May** to honour the contributions of nurses to society and recognise their role in the overall healthcare system.

- IND commemorates the **birth anniversary** of a English nurse, social reformer, and statistician **Florence Nightingale** (also known as the founder of modern nursing).
- The **theme** of International Nurses Day 2024 is “**Our Nurses. Our Future. The economic power of care**”.

The annual observance of IND is led by the International Council of Nurses (ICN).

Background:

i. In 1953, Dorothy Sutherland, an official with the United States (US) Department of Health, Education and Welfare, proposed to Dwight D. Eisenhower, the 34th President of the United States of America (USA) to declare “Nurses Day”.

ii. International Council of Nurses (ICN) has been celebrating the International Nurses Day since 1965.

iii. In January 1974, ICN proclaimed the 12th May of every year as the International Nurse Day. The date was chosen to mark the birth anniversary of Florence Nightingale.



World Telecommunication and Information Society Day 2024 – May 17

The United Nations (UN) **World Telecommunication and Information Society Day (WTISD)** is annually observed across the globe on **17 May** to raise awareness of the benefits of the Internet and other information and communication technologies (ICT).

- WTISD 2024 was observed under the theme: “**Digital Innovation for Sustainable Development.**”

Background:

i. World Telecommunication Day has been celebrated annually on 17 May since 1969.

ii. In November 2005, the World Summit on the Information Society (WSIS) urged the UN General Assembly (UNGA) to declare 17 May as World Information Society Day.

iii. The UNGA adopted Resolution A/RES/60/252 in March 2006 to celebrate World Information Society Day annually on 17 May.

iv. In November 2006, the ITU Plenipotentiary Conference in Antalya, Türkiye, decided to celebrate both events on 17 May as WTISD.



International Tea Day 2024 – May 21

The United Nations (UN)'s **International Tea Day** (ITD) is annually observed across the globe on **21st May** to promote sustainable production and consumption of tea and highlight the role of tea cultivation in combating hunger and poverty.

- **21st May 2024** marks the observance of the **5th ITD**.
- ITD is observed by the Food and Agriculture Organization (FAO) of the United Nations.

Background:

i. ITD has been celebrated since 2005 on 15th December in tea-producing countries like Bangladesh, Sri Lanka, Nepal, Vietnam, Indonesia, Kenya, Malawi, Malaysia, Uganda, India and Tanzania.

ii. On 19 December 2019, the UN General Assembly (UNGA) adopted the resolution A/RES/74/241 designating the 21st May of every year as International Tea Day.

iii. The **1st UN-recognised** International Tea Day was observed on **21 May 2020**.

Note: The 2024 ITD highlights women and their role in the tea sector.

National Anti-Terrorism Day 2024 – May 21

National Anti-Terrorism Day is annually observed across India on **21 May** to mark the **death anniversary** of former Prime Minister (PM) **Rajiv Gandhi**, who was assassinated in 1991 at Sriperumbudur, a village near Chennai, Tamil Nadu.

21 May 2024 marks the **33rd death anniversary** of the 6th PM of India, Rajiv Gandhi (1984 to 1989).

Background:

In **1992**, the Government of India (GoI) decided to observe **21 May** as **National Anti-Terrorism Day** to honour the memory of **Rajiv Gandhi**.

Indian Commonwealth Day 2024 – May 24

Commonwealth Day (formerly Empire Day) is annually observed by people all over the Commonwealth in Africa, Asia, the Caribbean and Americas, the Pacific, and Europe on the **2nd Monday of March**. But, **India** and certain other Commonwealth nations observe the Commonwealth Day on **24th May**.

- **Indian Commonwealth Day 2024** was observed on **24th May 2024**.
- **Commonwealth Day 2024** was observed on **11th March 2024**.
- Commonwealth Day honours shared values like democracy, human rights, and sustainable development.

Theme:

i. The theme for Commonwealth Day 2024 is '**One Resilient Common Future: Transforming our Common Wealth**'.

ii. It is also the theme of the **27th** Commonwealth Heads of Government Meeting (CHOGM), a biennial meeting of leaders from Commonwealth nations, scheduled in Samoa from 21-26 October 2024.

What is the Commonwealth?

The Commonwealth is an intergovernmental political association of 56 independent and

equal member states, representing 2.5 billion people—about one-third of the global population.

- The member states are committed to the values and principles of the Commonwealth Charter.
- Majority of Commonwealth are former territories of the British Empire.

Note:

i.The British monarch is considered as the symbolic head of the Commonwealth of Nations

ii.His Majesty King Charles III is the current Head of the Commonwealth.

History:

i.Commonwealth Day was first celebrated as Empire Day on 24 May 1902, to honour Queen Victoria, following her demise in 1901.

- It was not officially recognised as an annual event until 1916.

First-Ever UN World Football Day – 25 May 2024

The **first-ever** United Nations (UN)'s **World Football Day** was observed across the globe on **25th May 2024** to acknowledge the global reach of football and its impact across various spheres, including commerce, peace, and diplomacy.

- World Football Day recognises football's unique ability to create spaces for cooperation and connection worldwide.
- **25th May 2024** marks the **100th anniversary** of the 1924 Olympic Football Tournament held in Paris, France.



Background:

i.On 7th May 2024, the United Nations General Assembly (UNGA) adopted the resolution A/RES/78/281, proclaiming the **25th May** of every year as **World Football Day**.

ii.The resolution was initiated by Bahrain, Libya and Tajikistan and was subsequently unanimously adopted by 170 nations at the UNGA.

29th May 2024 marks the **71st anniversary** of the 1953 Mt Everest Summit.

- International Everest Day has been **celebrated since 2008**, following the death of Sir Edmund Hillary on 11th January 2008.
